Bishop Jennifer Reddall's Visit, December 8th

Have you discerned that it is time for you to be baptized, confirmed, received, or reaffirmed in the Episcopal Church? If so, then you're in luck! Bishop Jennifer Reddall will make her biannual visit to St. John's this year on December 8th. During her visit, she will administer the sacraments of the Church that only a bishop is authorized to administer. Confirmation is an adult affirmation of faith. When we are confirmed, we acknowledge that we wish to continue with our baptismal promises and we make this declaration in front of a bishop, one of the successors of the apostles. If we have been confirmed in a different tradition but we'd like to become official Episcopalians, we can be *received* into this communion. And sometimes, if we'd like to renew our baptismal and confirmation promises, we can be *reaffirmed*. We can only be confirmed or received once, but anyone can be reaffirmed at any time. And, of course, anyone can be baptized who wishes to receive that sacrament. Isn't it extra special if the baptism is performed by our bishop? If you are considering being baptized, confirmed, received, or reaffirmed, please contact the office. You will need to have some conversations with Fr. Tim and an educational component is expected. These rites are available for everyone, but they must be sought with intention and care. Let's make the bishop's visit a festive one! Contact us today.
