#### (Please note you do not have to itemize your taxes to be eligible)

Habitat for Humanity Central Arizona, a Christian-based organization, builds simple, decent and affordable homes in partnership with families in need. In 2024, Arizona taxpayers can get a dollar-for-dollar tax credit of up to \$938 on their state income tax return for charitable contributions made to a qualifying charitable organization; single taxpayers can contribute up to \$470 and married couples can contribute up to \$938.
